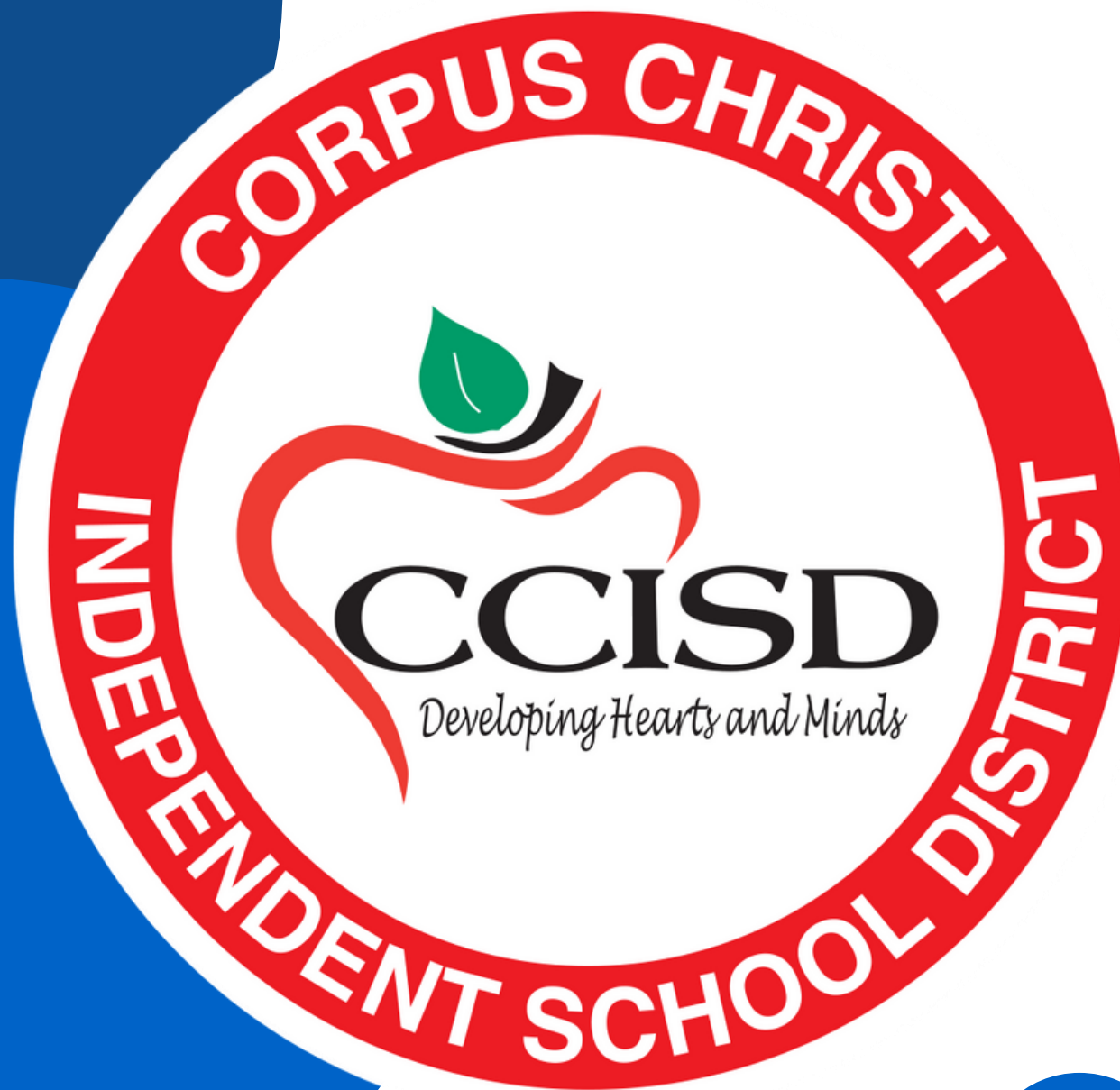

Classes of 2018 – 2021



change

- CCMR was not monitored at the district level.
- CTE, Advanced Academics, Guidance & Counseling, Special Education and the HS Principals all worked in isolation.
- Knowledge of CCMR was varied.
- District leaders saw the need for change.

Classes of 2022 – Present



- CCMR Coordinator Position Created
- CCMR Monitored at District Level
- Campus & District Leaders trained and regularly informed about CCMR
- CTE, Advanced Academics, Special Education, School Leadership, and Campus Leadership working together

What we are seeing with our current seniors:

- IBC Completion Rate / Level 2 Course is not negatively affecting us.
- College Bridge is allowing higher TSI Readiness at our alternative campus.
- TSI readiness rate is currently 5% higher than at the same time last year.
- Teachers/Counselors having more College & Career Related Discussions and lessons than ever before.
- Overall CCMR Rate is currently 8% higher than at the same time last year.
